1. Do you consider yourself or someone in your home to be in one of the "high-risk" categories for COVID-19 (e.g., older adults, and those with underlying health conditions, such as diabetes, lung disease, or heart disease)?

- a. Yes (52 – 66%)
- b. No (27 – 34%)
- c. No answer - 3

2. What is your age?

Summary – 61% respondents over 65 (roughly corresponds with #1)

- a. Under 18 – 0
- b. 18-24 – 0
- c. 25-34 – 2 (3%)
- d. 35-44 – 6 (8%)
- e. 45-54 – 11 (14%)
- f. 55-64 – 12 (15%)
- g. 65-74 – 25 (31%)
- h. 74+ - 24 (30%)
- i. No answer - 2

3. If you have worshipped online in the past three months, what has been your experience?

Summary – 96% met/exceed expectations

- a. Exceeded Expectations – 53 (68%)
- b. Met expectations – 22 (28%)
- c. Below expectations – 2 (3%)
- d. I have not worshipped online during social distancing – 1 (1%)

4. Given your current understanding of the spread of coronavirus, which of the following is necessary for you to attend an in-person worship service? (check all that apply)

Summary – 25% comfortable now;

35-39% connected to lifting of other restrictions;

34% waiting for vaccine/treatment

- a. Stay-at-home orders have been lifted – 32 (39%)
- b. Other public gatherings have resumed (concerts, theaters, sporting events, etc.) – 29 (35%)
- c. When a vaccine or treatment for COVID-19 becomes widely available – 28 (34%)
- d. I am already comfortable attending – 20 (24%)
- e. Other (please specify) NOTE: This answer option is only available in the paid (\$15 monthly) version) – 8 (10%)
- f. No answer - 4

5. Given your current understanding, when do you predict you might feel comfortable attending in-person worship?

Summary – 35% immediately/summer; 33% Fall; 26% winter or later

- a. Immediately – 10 (12%)
- b. Summer 2020 – 19 (23%)

- c. Fall 2020 – 27 (33%)
 - d. Winter 2020-21 – 16 (20%)
 - e. Spring 2021 – 1 (1%)
 - f. Longer than a year from now – 4 (5%)
 - g. Never – 0
 - h. No answer - 5
- 6. If in-person worship services (limited number of physically-distanced, low-risk persons with masks, who will not be singing) were offered in mid-July or August, how comfortable do you think you will you feel attending?**
- Summary: 23% eager/comfortable; 33% cautious; 32% very uncomfortable (Question 5 indicates this would shift toward comfort/caution by fall 2020)**
- a. Eager – 6 (7%)
 - b. Comfortable – 17 (21%)
 - c. Somewhat cautious – 27 (33%)
 - d. Very uncomfortable – 26 (32%)
 - e. No answer - 6
- 7. What precautions will you personally take when returning to worship?**
- Summary (arranged in order of preference):**
- a. I will wear a face mask – 61 (74%)
 - b. I will avoid shaking hands or other physical contact – 61 (74%)
 - c. I will stand and sit 6 feet away from non-family members – 60 (73%)
 - d. I will bring hand sanitizer – 47 (57%)
 - e. * I will avoid the restrooms – 29 (35%)
- We can expect pushback if we limit restroom use – yet see Question 8 below (few people will want to help sanitize the restrooms between use)**
- f. Other (please specify) NOTE: This answer option is only available in the paid (\$15 monthly) version) – 11 (13%)
 - g. No answer – 8 (10%)
 - h. I will wear gloves – 5 (6%)
 - i. None of these – 2 (2%)
- 8. What volunteer positions would you be willing to fill?**
- Summary: We will need to be intentional about recruiting a sufficient number of support volunteers to make in-person worship work during the pre-vaccine quarantine**
- a. Entry screener – 20 (24%)
 - b. Ushers – 16 (20%)
 - c. Set-up crew (tapes lines and signs – some sanitizing) – 11 (13%)
 - d. Cleanup crew (removal of tape and outdoor signs – some sanitizing) – 14 (17%)
 - e. **No answer – 52 (63%) – potential disconnect between desire to attend in-person worship and recognition of the volunteer support required to make it safe**
- 9. Beyond online worship services, which of the following have helped you feel connected to St. Paul's during the quarantine? (select all that apply)**
- Summary (arranged in order of preference):**
- a. Weekly email/bulletin/newsletter from the church office – 47 (57%)
 - b. Weekly calls from our member callers – 42 (51%)

- c. Church Facebook site (posts) – 36 (44%)
- d. Church Zoom meetings – 35 (43%)
- e. Church website – 27 (33%)
- f. Weekly online prayer gatherings – 18 (22%)
- g. Adult studies group via Zoom – 16 (20%)
- h. No answer – 14 (17%)
- i. Sending and/or receiving cards and letters – 13 (16%)

A key aspect of community health as this quarantine season unfolds will be experimenting with novel and intentional ways of connecting people of different ages at St. Paul's, using high-tech and low-tech methods.
