*LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT WREATH:

Liturgist – Melissa Brooks

One: We light the third candle on the Advent wreath as a bright light that reminds us of the guidance we have in God's word and in Jesus Christ, the word made flesh. The prophet Isaiah spoke of a highway prepared by God, the way of holiness.

Many: Holy Child of Bethlehem, be born in us today. You were born to redeem us. Through faith in your name we walk in the way of holiness.

One: We light these candles as signs of our shocking hope, just peace, and fierce joy. May our lives shine with the joy of the Light who lives in our hearts as we wait and work for the coming of God's kingdom on earth as it is in heaven.

Many: We wait as people who experience hardship and pain, yet we are called to witness to the persistent joy that sustains our life as God's people.

All Singing: O holy child of Bethlehem, descend to us we pray. Cast out our sin and enter in, be born in us today. We hear the Christmas angels, the great glad tidings tell. O come to us, abide with us, our Lord Emmanuel.

FIRST LESSON: Isaiah 61:1-4, 8-11 (CEB)

The LORD God's spirit is upon me,

because the LORD has anointed me.

He has sent me

to bring good news to the poor,

to bind up the brokenhearted,

to proclaim release for captives, and liberation for prisoners,

² to proclaim the year of the LORD's favor and a day of vindication for our God, to comfort all who mourn, 3 to provide for Zion's mourners, to give them a crown in place of ashes, oil of joy in place of mourning, a mantle of praise in place of discouragement. They will be called Oaks of Righteousness, planted by the LORD to glorify himself. ⁴They will rebuild the ancient ruins; they will restore formerly deserted places; they will renew ruined cities, places deserted in generations past. I, the LORD, love justice; I hate robbery and dishonesty.^[a] I will faithfully give them their wage, and make with them an enduring covenant. ⁹ Their offspring will be known among the nations, and their descendants among the peoples. All who see them will recognize that they are a people blessed by the LORD. ¹⁰ I surely rejoice in the LORD; my heart is joyful because of my God, because he has clothed me with clothes of victory, wrapped me in a robe of righteousness like a bridegroom in a priestly crown, and like a bride adorned in jewelry. ¹¹ As the earth puts out its growth, and as a garden grows its seeds, so the LORD God will grow righteousness and praise before all the nations.

*GOSPEL LESSON: John 1:6-8, 19-28 (CEB)

A man named John was sent from God. ⁷He came as a witness to testify concerning the light, so that through him everyone would believe in the light. ⁸He himself wasn't the light, but his mission was to testify concerning the light.

This is John's testimony when the Jewish leaders in Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to ask him, "Who are you?" ²⁰ John confessed (he didn't deny but confessed), "I'm not the Christ." ²¹ They asked him, "Then who are you? Are you Elijah?" John said, "I'm not." "Are you the prophet?" John answered, "No."

²² They asked, "Who are you? We need to give an answer to those who sent us. What do you say about yourself?" ²³ John replied,

"I am a voice crying out in the wilderness, Make the Lord's path straight, just as the prophet Isaiah said."

²⁴ Those sent by the Pharisees ²⁵ asked, "Why do you baptize if you aren't the Christ, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?" ²⁶ John answered, "I baptize with water. Someone greater stands among you, whom you don't recognize. ²⁷ He comes after me, but I'm not worthy to untie his sandal straps." ²⁸ This encounter took place across the Jordan in Bethany where John was baptizing.

Reader 1: : It is right to give you thanks and praise, Great God of the Coming Dawn, for in each new day you surprise the earth with splendor. Your Spirit moves across the face of the waters and brings forth life. At the dawn of all things in a garden you worked the earth. Made from the earth, made by your hand, we forgot who we were, we forgot who you were and we tried to remake ourselves. We rejected your love and fell into sin and death. Yet even in our darkness you continue to speak light and life. And so we who live on the edge of this land look across the waters to the horizon. We come to live on the edge of your new and promised day. And so, with your people on earth and all the company of heaven we praise your name and join their unending hymn:
