FIRST LESSON: *Numbers 21:4-9 (CEB)*

They marched from Mount Hor on the Reed Sea road around the land of Edom. The people became impatient on the road. ⁵ The people spoke against God and Moses: "Why did you bring us up from Egypt to kill us in the desert, where there is no food or water. And we detest this miserable bread!" ⁶ So the Lord sent poisonous snakes among the people and they bit the people. Many of the Israelites died.

⁷ The people went to Moses and said, "We've sinned, for we spoke against the Lord and you. Pray to the Lord so that he will send the snakes away from us." So Moses prayed for the people.

⁸ The Lord said to Moses, "Make a poisonous snake and place it on a pole. Whoever is bitten can look at it and live." ⁹ Moses made a bronze snake and placed it on a pole. If a snake bit someone, that person could look at the bronze snake and live.

*GOSPEL LESSON: *John 3:14-21* (CEB)

¹⁹ "This is the basis for judgment: The light came into the world, and people loved darkness more than the light, for their actions are evil. ²⁰ All who do wicked things hate the light and don't come to the light for fear that their actions will be exposed to the light. ²¹ Whoever does the truth comes to the light so that it can be seen that their actions were done in God."

Reader 1: The Lord be with you.

ALL: And also with you.

Reader 1: Lift up your hearts.

ALL: We lift them up to the Lord.

Reader 1: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

ALL: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Reader 1: Holy God of wisdom and power, you alone are worthy of our worship. At your word, creation came into being: stars danced, sunlight gleamed on water, and the earth was filled with growing things. You gave us your commandments to guide us in the ways of justice and righteousness. When we failed to obey your words, choosing greed and self-interest over compassion and caring, your love for us remained steadfast. You sent prophets to call us back to you, reminding us that your ways are filled with abundance. Your scriptures kept your words before us, as generations heard your call. And so, with all of creation, and the great company of heaven we praise you as we join their unending hymn:

ALL: Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Reader 2: Holy are you and blessed is your child Jesus Christ. In his life and teaching, he showed us your ways. Jesus welcomed all people, offering forgiveness and a new beginning. He offered healing to aching bodies and

Through your child, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy church, all honor and glory is yours, Holy God, now and forever.

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For Thine is the Kingdom, the Power and the Glory Forever. AMEN.
