FIRST LESSON: *Job 1:1; 2:1-10* (CEB)

A man in the land of Uz was named Job. That man was honest, a person of absolute integrity; he feared God and avoided evil. **2** One day the divine beings came to present themselves before the Lord. The Adversary also came among them to present himself before the Lord. The Lord said to the Adversary, "Where have you come from?" The Adversary answered the Lord, "From wandering throughout the earth."

³ The Lord said to the Adversary, "Have you thought about my servant Job, for there is no one like him on earth, a man who is honest, who is of absolute integrity, who reveres God and avoids evil? He still holds on to his integrity, even though you incited me to ruin him for no reason." ⁴ The Adversary responded to the Lord, "Skin for skin—people will give up everything they have in exchange for their lives. ⁵ But stretch out your hand and strike his bones and flesh. ² Some Pharisees came and, trying to test him, they asked, "Does the Law allow a man to divorce his wife?"
