UPDATE!!! UMCOR RELIEF SUPPLY BUCKETS: Supplies are being **collected through November 24**th; all items must be new and exactly as described below to all fit in the bucket used. The buckets have already been donated - supplies needed are:

One 32-64 oz bottle liquid laundry detergent

One-16-40 oz bottle liquid concentrate household cleaner--no spray cleaners

One 16-34 oz bottle liquid dish soap

One 4-8 oz pump spray air freshener

One 6-14 oz pump spray insect repellent (pack of 10-20 wipes also acceptable)

One scrub brush with or without handle

18 reusable cleaning wipes--no terry cloth, microfiber or paper towels remove from packaging

Five scouring pads-no stainless steel or ones with soap in them remove from packaging
