FIRST LESSON: Amos 7:7-17 (CEB)

⁷ This is what the Lord showed me: The Lord was standing by a wall, with a plumb line in his hand. ⁸ The Lord said to me, "Amos, what do you see?"

"A plumb line," I said.

Then the Lord said,

"See, I am setting a plumb line

in the middle of my people Israel.

I will never again forgive them.

⁹ The shrines of Isaac will be made desolate,

and the holy places of Israel will be laid waste, and I will rise against the house of Jeroboam with the sword."

²⁵ A legal expert stood up to test Jesus. "Teacher," he said, "what must I do to gain eternal life?"

- 6. Hamburger Helper

These non-perishables are needed to keep our pantry stocked:

Chef Boyardee, beef stew, Spam ,pancake mix/syrup, snacks - cookies, crackers etc.
