### Currently our pantry is bare and needs these items:

- pasta/pasta sauce
- canned items like Chef Boyardee, beef stew, Spam, chicken, tuna
- canned fruit
- peanut butter and jelly
- any boxed items like mac'n cheese, stuffing, mashed potatoes

### These non-perishables are needed to keep our pantry stocked:

Chef Boyardee, beef stew, Spam ,pancake mix/syrup, snacks - cookies, crackers etc. Toiletries are stocked for now.
