FIRST LESSON: *Exodus 24:12-18 (CEB)*

<sup>12</sup> The Lord said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain and wait there. I'll give you the stone tablets with the instructions and the commandments that I've written in order to teach them."

<sup>13</sup> So Moses and his assistant Joshua got up, and Moses went up God's mountain. <sup>14</sup> Moses had said to the elders, "Wait for us here until we come back to you. Aaron and Hur will be here with you. Whoever has a legal dispute may go to them."

<sup>15</sup> Then Moses went up the mountain, and the cloud covered the mountain. <sup>16</sup> The Lord's glorious presence settled on Mount Sinai, and the cloud covered it for six days. On the seventh day the Lord called to Moses from the cloud. <sup>17</sup> To the Israelites, the Lord's glorious presence looked like a blazing fire on top of the mountain. <sup>18</sup> Moses entered the cloud and went up the mountain. Six days later Jesus took Peter, James, and John his brother, and brought them to the top of a very high mountain. 2 He was transformed in front of them. His face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as light.

3 Moses and Elijah appeared to them, talking with Jesus. 4 Peter reacted to all of this by saying to Jesus, “Lord, it’s good that we’re here. If you want, I’ll make three shrines: one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah.”

5 While he was still speaking, look, a bright cloud overshadowed them. A voice from the cloud said, “This is my Son whom I dearly love. I am very pleased with him. Listen to him!” 6 Hearing this, the disciples fell on their faces, filled with awe.

7 But Jesus came and touched them. “Get up,” he said. “Don’t be afraid.” 8 When they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus.

9 As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus commanded them, “Don’t tell anybody about the vision until the Human One is raised from the dead.”

**Receiving Payment:** Once processed, the Treasurer will remit the payment to the requester.

**Please Note:** Disbursement Vouchers must be submitted within 2 weeks from the incurred expense. After 2 weeks, reimbursement will need to be approved by the Finance Committee.

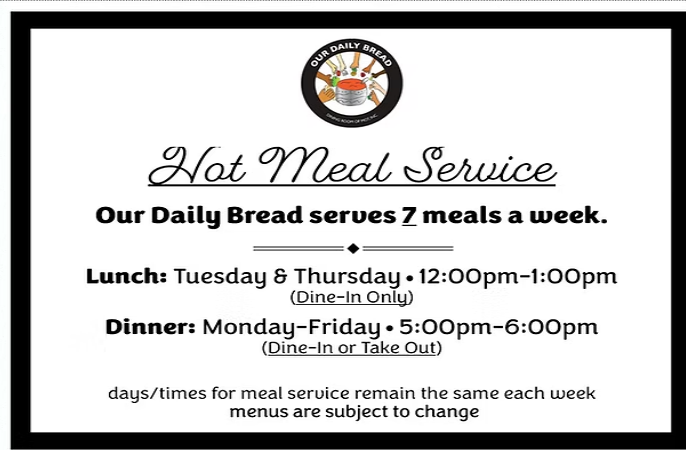
### Deep Roots
